ACCOMMODATIONS

Most hotels offer either 1 or 2 beds per room. A smoking/non-smoking room or upstairs/downstairs room may be requested at time of booking.

LUGGAGE

Please limit luggage to 1 large bag and 1 carry-on per person. Baggage handling will only carry the large bag.

PARKING

The departure point is at the Temple Walmart parking lot, 3401 S.31st St. (area behind McDonalds), unless flyer states otherwise. The bus will pick up at other points on request if they are enroute to the destination.

RESERVATIONS

Reservations may be made by phone (254)939-0731 or by writing to: *Your Travel Agent*, 2423 North Main St, Belton, TX, 76513. Please include [1] your name, address & telephone number, [2] number of reservations needed, [3] name and date of tour, [4] type of room needed (ie. single, double, smoking or non-smoking) if applicable. Last minute reservations are accepted if space is available.

PAYMENT

Payments are to be made according to printed flyer information. Checks are payable to *Your Travel Agent*. Please include name and date of tour on check. We are unable to accept credit cards except on trips that include a tour company, cruise, or air.

REFUND POLICY

Day trips: Generally, money is refundable up to 7 days before trip, except for those that involve prepaid, nonrefundable tickets or meals. The balance will be refunded. **Overnight trips:** The deposit is nonrefundable, the remaining balance is refundable. **Cruise, Package Tours, or Fly-in Tours:** These have their own cancellation fee policies and trip cancellation insurance which will be printed in the flyer for that particular tour.
